“Rottweilers aren’t for everyone. They take a lot of time and commitment to train and need exercised daily. Training has to start from an early age and be consistent as the puppy grows into an adult dog,” said Mick Svaljek, RCV President.

In official descriptions of the breed from around the world, Rottweilers are described as placid, devoted, obedient and eager to work, along with fearless and always alert.

“However,” Mr Svaljek continued, “The payoff for the time spent training will be returned a hundred times over when you can enjoy the company of such a loyal and loveable companion.”

Mr Svaljek suggests anyone who is thinking about getting a Rottweiler should attend the show to speak to the experts on the breed and see if this is the sort of dog that would suit their lifestyle.
